Parish Future Group update.

Please see the open statement from the Parish Future Group to Archbishop John Wilson and the Diocese of Southwark. Also, a clarifying note regarding the pre-school and Father Peter's accommodation.

The parish of St. Thomas More, West Malling would like to make the following statement.

On the 20th February 2020, Archbishop John Wilson and officers of the Diocese of Southwark, attended a meeting with members of the Parish Future Group of St. Thomas More Parish and Father Peter Soper, parish priest.

Firstly, we would like to acknowledge the issues and circumstances that led to the proposal to sell the site here at West Malling. This was the result of a regrettable breakdown and failure of communications within our parish.

At the meeting it was established and agreed that the church within its grounds would be retained by the parish. Further discussions are ongoing regarding The Hermitage, stable block and the remainder of the site.

We would like to publicly record our grateful thanks to the Archbishop and the diocese for the constructive manner in which they have approached this meeting.

We now look forward to building our community and working in collaboration with the diocese to our mutual benefit.

Clarifying statement.

We are aware that this is a very difficult time for both parents and staff of the pre-school regards to the continued uncertainty. To be clear, we will retain a pre-school in our parish, it's location however, is to be determined. Our clear aim and mandate is to have the pre-school remain within the stable block and we are working hard to expedite matters to a conclusion. We ask for your patience and understanding while we endeavour to meet this aim. We are also active in acquiring new accommodation and office facilities for Father Peter, within the area and have several properties to consider further. We want to reassure you that any accommodation considered would have the full approval of Father Peter.

THE SANTA MARTA GROUP is an international initiative of the Catholic Bishops throughout the world working in partnership with the police and other agencies to bring an end to human trafficking - a form of modern-day slavery. It is a fact that human trafficking exists in every country, and probably in some form in every city and town - and, sad to say, that Kent area is highlighted as one of the many 'Hot Spots' in the UK. It is hard for us to comprehend that people are being tricked, deceived and traded in our part of the world. The Bishops Conference of England & Wales, through the Santa Marta Group, seeks to create awareness of the trafficking situation and abuses that go on within the agricultural sectors around Kent, but they need the help of some volunteers from our parish to achieve their aim. The Santa Marta Group is, therefore, appealing for volunteers to be trained to assist in creating awareness of the problem of modern-day slavery in our parishes. The volunteers will be commissioned to go to parishes to help promote the campaign against the abuses in the agricultural sector. The training will take place in areas of Kent on two different dates. Please feel free to attend any of the dates. The first will be on Saturday 28th March 2020 at The Hermitage, More Park, West Malling, Kent, ME19 6HN from 10.00am to 2.30pm and the second will be on Saturday 4th April 2020 at St. Thomas of Canterbury Hall (entry in Canterbury Lane), Canterbury Lane, Canterbury, Kent, CT1 2HJ, from 10.00am to 2.30pm. You are invited to attend any of the two training sessions. Please bring a packed lunch. The training programme is also opened to all interested parishioners. If you are interested to be a Volunteer in this project, please speak to your parish clergy. All are invited to the training programme - thank you.
