(d) <u>CHURCH OFFERINGS</u> - Please do not bring or leave money or envelopes to the Church or house. The best thing for those who can is to arrange 'standing orders' with their bank, which we would appreciate to keep the Church and Parish going. With self-denial envelopes, the best thing would be just to keep the money collected at home until we are able to receive them at Church. In all of this, please, only if you can afford it - your needs must come first.

- (e) <u>BAPTISMS RECONCILIATION WEDDINGS FRIDAY EXPOSITION CHILDREN'S LIT-URGY PRAYER GROUPS</u> These are suspended for the foreseeable future. If you have problems about reconciliation/confession please contact me.
- (f) **FIRST COMMUNION** will be postponed until at least September and maybe after this depending on the coronavirus. First Communion classes are also suspended.
- (g) PARISH GROUPS AND MEETINGS are all suspended for the foreseeable future. This includes the Lent Area Group Masses and the Youth Group Passion Play. Please keep in touch with each other by email or phone.
